BYLAW NO. 86 13/82

A BYLAW FOR PROHIBITING the planting of trees or shrubs or the placing of stone, earth or gravel piles, portable structures, machinery or other objects on private property The Council of the R.M. of Clayton No.333 in the Province of Saskatchewan enact as follows;

- 1) That planting of trees or shrubs of the placing of stone earth or gravel piles, portable structures, machinery or other objects on private property be prohibited
 - 1) within 150 feet from the center line of any road allowance other vthan a provincial Highway,
 - 2) within such distance as specified by this bylaw not exceeding three hundred(390) feet from the intersection of road allowances other than provincial highways and providing that where a tree or shrub has been planted or a tone, earth or gravel pile or portable structure or any machinery or other object has been placed on private property contrary to the bylaw, the Council may by order direct the owner of the property to remove the tree, shrub, stone, earth, or gravel pile, portable structure, machinery or other object and that section 185 of the R.M. Act shall apply, mutatis mutandis, if the owner fails to comply with the order,
